Part II: The Application Phase

After the Practical Phase, you will fulfill a contract with yourself through your "Ticket" – five Scouting goals that you'll establish and then complete over the next 18 months (ending March 2013).

What does the Course cost?

The course fee is \$325. Early registration fee (paid in full by 6/30/11) is \$300. All food, instructional materials and recognition are included. A \$50.00 deposit reserves your place on Gilwell Field. The course is limited to 48 participants, so please don't delay — send your deposit to reserve your place now.

What is Required to Participate?

-  Be registered as an adult leader in the BSA
-  Complete the training course specific for your scouting position including Youth Protection Training
-  Provide the Annual Health and Medical Record form valid through October 2011
-  Bring to the course an eagerness to learn ... and a willingness to have a lot of fun
